What does Linguistics do?

- Human interaction is based on language. Language use varies according to speaker and context.
- Linguistics studies how language is structured and used by humans:
 - 1. Hi there, how's it going?
 - 2. How do you do, Ms. Smith?
 - 3. It is very cold in here.

What does Linguistics do?

We study

- speech sounds (phonetics and phonology),
- structure of words (morphology) and sentences (syntax),
- word and sentence meaning (semantics, pragmatics),
- language variation (sociolinguistics),
- language development (historical linguistics),
- first & second language learning (language acquisition)
- and much, much more!




